

#### Description

The LH1500 is robust, ideal for telecom and ground fault applications. It is a SPST normally open switch (1 Form A) that replaces electromechanical relays in many applications. It is constructed using a GaAIAs LED for actuation control and an integrated monolithic die for the switch output. The die, fabricated in a high-voltage dielectrically isolated technology, is comprised of a photodiode array, switch control circuitry and MOSFET switches. In addition, it employs current-limiting circuitry which meets FCC 68.302 and other regulatory voltage surge requirements when overvoltage protection is provided.




Figure 1. Recommended Operating Conditions




Figure 2. LED Voltage vs. Temperature




Figure 3. LED Forward Current vs.Forward Voltage




Figure 4. LED Reverse Current vs. LED Reverse Voltage








Figure 5. LED Current for Switch Turn-on vs. Temperature





Figure 6. LED Dropout Voltage vs. Temperature









Figure 8. Load Current vs. Load Voltage








Figure 10. Variation in ON-Resistance vs. LED Current




Figure 11. Switch Capacitance vs. Applied Voltage




Figure 12. Insertion Loss vs. Frequency




Figure 13. Leakage Current vs. Applied Voltage




Figure 14. Output Isolation






Figure 15. Switch Breakdown Voltage vs. Load Current




Figure 17. Switch Offset Voltage vs. Temperature




Figure 18. Switch Offset Voltage vs. LED Current




Figure 19. Turn-on Time vs. Temperature




Figure 20. Turn-off Time vs. Temperature




Figure 21. Turn-on Time vs. LED Current





Figure 22. Turn-off Time vs. LED Current


